



## Description of Votes

Vote 1: Nadler Amendment #1 would create an exception for a grandparent or adult sibling. The amendment failed, 7-Yes, 16-no. “No” was a pro-life vote.

Vote 2: Scott Amendment #2 would create an exception for a sibling. The amendment failed by voice vote.

Vote 3: Scott Amendment #3 would create an exception for taxicab drivers, bus drivers, or others in business of professional transport. The amendment failed, 10-yes, 14-no. “No” was a pro-life vote.

Vote 4: Watt Amendment #6 would create an exception for health in first main section. The amendment failed, 11-yes, 13-no. “No” was a pro-life vote.

Vote 5: Watt Amendment #7 would create an exception for health in the second main section. The amendment failed, 12-yes, 15-no. “No” was a pro-life vote.

Vote 6: Jackson-Lee Amendment #4 would create an exception for clergy, godparents, aunts, uncles, or first cousins. The amendment failed, 11-yes, 16-no. “No” was a pro-life vote.

Vote 7: Jackson-Lee Amendment #10 would create exceptions based on pregnancy being the result of sexual contact with various persons. The amendment failed, 11-yes, 17-no. “No” was a pro-life vote.

Vote 8: Jackson-Lee Amendment #15 would substitute 120 for 45 for days after enactment when act would take effect. The amendment failed, 11-yes, 17-no. “No” was a pro-life vote.

Vote 9: Johnson Amendment #8 would create an exception related to physical safety of minor. The amendment failed, 11-yes, 18-no. “No” was a pro-life vote.

Vote 10: Quigley Amendment #11 would create exceptions if the minor’s pregnancy was the result of rape or incest. The amendment failed, 11-yes, 15-no. “No” was a pro-life vote.

Vote 11: Chu Amendment #9 would strike “save the life” exception language and substitute “protect the life and health.” The amendment failed, 9-yes, 15-no. “No” was a pro-life vote.

Vote 12: Nadler Amendment #12 would create exceptions to prosecution or civil suits based on beliefs about the judicial bypass procedure of the minor’s State of residence. The amendment failed, 8-yes, 16-no. “No” was a pro-life vote.

Vote 13: Scott Amendment #13 (in block with Amendment #14) would create limitations on prosecution. The amendments failed, 14-yes, 17-no. “No” was a pro-life vote.

Vote 14: Final passage—H.R. 2299 was approved, 20-yes, 13-no. “Yes” was a pro-life vote.
